## UNIFORM POLICY

### AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- It is the policy of the school that all pupils wear the school tracksuit during school activities.
- The wearing of the school tracksuit helps to promote a positive image for the school.
- It makes pupils recognisable as members of the school.
- It contributes to the development of a sense of pride in the school.
- The wearing of the school tracksuit prevents competition among pupils in the matter of dress and therefore reduces costs for parents/guardians.

### UNIFORM DETAILS

The official school uniform is as follows:

#### All pupils:

Navy tracksuits with school crest/ name on the sweatshirt.

Red polo shirt.

Plain dark coloured runners or shoes.

School tracksuit bottoms are **plain** navy bottoms that can be purchased in O'Neills, Dunnes, Marks & Spencers or similar.

No branded track suit bottoms are permitted.

#### Hot days

Plain navy cotton shorts (no denim, branded shorts, or club shorts) are permitted on warm days, to be worn with the school red polo shirt.

#### Footwear:

Students should wear age appropriate **plain dark coloured** shoes or runners, which can be easily opened and closed.

## **Jewellery:**

Children can wear stud earrings. Due to health and safety regulations, children must not wear necklaces, bracelets or earrings other than studs. Children who wear such jewellery will have them removed, until home-time.

Children are encouraged to wear simple watches which would aid in them learning how to read time. However smart watches are not acceptable.

- The wearing of the school tracksuit is compulsory in school and at school related activities, unless otherwise specified.
- The school tracksuit should be clean and neat at all times.

## **Make- up/false tan:**

The wearing of make-up and/or false tan is not permitted.
